Minutes of meeting held in the chamber of Secretary (Sports) on 21st May, 2018 to consider the ACTC proposal of "Indian Weightlifting Federation" (IWLF) for the year 2018-19.

Secretary (Sports) chaired the meeting. JS (Sports), DDG, Regional Director (TEAMS), Project Officer and others were present. From "Indian Weightlifting Federation" (IWLF), the following were present:-

- 1. Shri Birendra Prasad Baishya President.
- 2. Shri Sahdev Yadav Secretary-General.
- 3. Shri Suneet Chopra Assistant Secretary.
- 2. Federation informed that :-
 - Coaching camps are being held at NSNIS, Patiala.
 - Sport shoes and Weightlifting shoes, which are part of consumables/equipment, are required to be procured.
 - The number of camps after Asian Games would be reduced; further, campers not performing well in the Asian Games would be removed from camps.
 - In CWG elite athletes included under TOP Scheme had performed well and won medals. In Asian Games, India will win three medals out of which one will be Gold.
- Secretary (Sports) observed that:-
 - Anti-doping measures are not part of ACTC. Expenditure
 incurred in this connection by the Federation will not be
 reimbursed under ACTC. Similarly, expenditure on coaching
 courses, referees and technical officials are not part of ACTC
 Federation has to bear the expenditure on these aspects.
 - For procurement of equipment/consumables, Federation should submit a list along with specifications. Thereafter, SAI would initiate procurement process.
 - After qualifying for Olympics, camps should be held continuously upto Tokyo Olympics, 2020. Federation should ensure this to enhance the performance of lifters.

4. Thereafter, the ACTC proposal of the Federation was taken up for consideration. Various components of ACTC were discussed and following decisions were taken. The decision taken on each component of ACTC is under:-

I. National Coaching Camps for seniors (Men and Women):-

• There are 12 coaching camps proposed under ACTC upto 31st March, 2019. Number of campers including coaches and support staff in a camp would not exceed 60. In some camps, this number may get reduced, on no occasion, this number will exceed. Financial support for each camp would be provided to the Federation as per Govt. norms. Camps for seniors would also include juniors, as no separate camps have been proposed for juniors under ACTC.

Subject to the above, the meeting approved all the 12 coaching camps proposed under ACTC upto March, 2019 at an estimated cost of Rs. 4.21 cr. List of names of campers including coaches and support staff is placed at "Annexure-A".(1) & (2)

II. International training/competition/exposures for seniors (Men and Women):-

 The meeting noted that 2 training camps one in Thailand and another in Kazakhstan have been proposed. These training camps are required in connection with preparation for Asian Games, 2018 and International Weightlifting Federation Sr. World Weightlifting Championship, qualifying tournament for Olympics, 2020. Therefore, the meeting approved the two training programmes.

In addition, it also approved participation of the team in 2018 IWF Sr. WWC at Ashgabat, Turkmenistan, which is a qualifying tournament for Olympics. Participation in this tournament is, therefore, mandatory.

Expenditure for the two training camps and one qualifying tournament is estimated to be Rs. 2.04 cr. These are required in connection with preparation for Asian Games and also for participation in a mandatory event. The meeting, therefore, approved them. Financial support for the international training and tournament would be provided to the Federation following Govt.

(Note:- Names of players, coaches and support staff would not be available at this stage, as selection trials are to be conducted on 28.5.2018, after which only players, coaches and support staff, who would participate in the international training programmes and mandatory event would be known).

III. Coaches and support staff for seniors (Men and Women):-

(i) Coaches

 There is already one National Coach Shri Vijay Sharma from Railways. In addition, 7 Assistant Coaches at no cost to Govt. are with the Federation. Two more Assistant Coaches at Govt. cost have been proposed.

The meeting decided that details of two Assistant Coaches may be submitted to consider their appointment.

- Subsequently, Federation vide their letter dated 21st May, 2018 submitted the names of 6 Assistant Coaches only (whereas in the ACTC proposal, a total of 9 Assistant Coaches have been stated). This discrepancy was discussed with the Federation. They informed that another communication they would send clarifying the position.
- Hence, the aspect of "Assistant Coaches" will be considered on file
 as and when the Federation submits the proposal. Whatever
 amount is approved on this account by the Competent Authority,
 would be added to the ACTC budget of the Federation.

(ii) Support staff

- The meeting approved the following support staff, proposed by the Federation:-
 - (i) One Physio (male) on a monthly remuneration of Rs. 40,000/- as per the scheme of assistance to NSFs.
 - (ii) One Physio (female) on a monthly remuneration of Rs. 40,000/- as per the scheme of assistance to NSFs.
 - (iii) Services of Expert Physio –cum- Nutritionist on a monthly remuneration of (Rs. 1.00 lakh p.m.) would be considered for elite athletes, who are part of TOPS list. Therefore, expenditure in this regard would be booked under the individual's budget under TOPS.

- (iv) Appointment of two Masseurs and one Masseur is also approved. However, Federation gave names of Two Masseurs and one Masseuse only. Both the Masseur and Masseur would be on a monthly remuneration of Rs. 25,000/- p.m. as per norms. Therefore, for the present, under ACTC, the meeting approved two Masseurs and one Masseur only.
- (v) Federation also proposed one Foreign Physio Expert and one Foreign Masseur/Masseuse under ACTC. Federation has not so far identified the Experts. Since their services are required for 12 months, the Federation has to follow the prescribed procedure for appointment of foreign experts. This would take quite sometime; even the remuneration proposed in the ACTC proposal may undergo change. The proposal being pre-mature the meeting decided that appointment of Foreign Experts would be considered after all the procedural formalities are completed.

(iii) Sports equipment (consumables and portables):-

The meeting approved purchase of consumables like training/jogging/running shoes, belts and knee caps for athletes @ of Rs. 20,000/- per set. Maximum number of athletes admitted in a camp is not more than 44. Therefore, the meeting approved Rs. 8.80 lakh for procurement of equipment under ACTC.

IV. National Coaching camps for youth and juniors:-

- The meeting was informed that the following camps have already been held and financial support, as per norms, also had been released to the Federation with the approval of Competent Authority:-
 - (i)Camp for preparation of 2018 Asian Youth Championships, a qualifying event for 2018 Youth Olympic Games at NSNIS, Patiala for 30 days from 1.4.18 to 30.4.18 at a total cost of Rs.35 lakh.
 - (ii)Camp for preparation of 2018 Asian Junior Championships at NSNIS, Patiala for 30 days from 1st April to 30th April, 2018 at a total cost of Rs. 18 lakh.

- (iii) Names of campers including coaches and support staff, who participated in these two different camps are given at "Annexure-B".(1),(2)& (3)
- (iv) Therefore, the meeting ratified holding of the camps as well as the amount released to the Federation for holding the camps.
- (v) The other camps proposed in the ACTC proposal are not approved, as there are no international competitions upto July, 2019.

V. International competitions/exposures for youth and junior:-

- The meeting was informed that 16 players, 4 coaches and 2 support staff, forming a team for participation in 2018 Asian Youth Championships, qualifying tournament for Youth Olympics in Uzbekistan from 28th April to 30th April had been approved on file by the Competent Authority at a total cost of Rs. 38.50 lakh.
- Similarly, another team of 16 players, 3 coaches and 2 support staff participated in 2018 Asian Junior Championships in Uzbekistan (a mandatory competition) from 20th April to 30th April, 2018 was also approved by the Competent Authority on file. The total financial support approved was Rs. 31.50 lakh. List of players and coaches who participated in these two different competitions is placed at "Annexure-C".(1)&(2)
- ACTC meeting, therefore, ratified the two proposals, as per details given above.
- Meeting also approved the proposal of the Federation to provide a foreign exposure to youth and juniors for participation in 2018 World Junior Championships (a mandatory tournament) in Uzbekistan from 6th July to 15 July, 2018 (10 days) at a total estimated cost of Rs. 18,09,500/-. The actual quantum of financial support would be decided when the Federation submits the proposal, which would be examined as per norms. The team for these competitions would consist of 03 players and 02 coaches. List of players and coaches is placed at "Annexure-D".

VI. Coaches and support staff for juniors (Boys and Girls):-

- Federation informed that Ms. Hansa Sharma, a retired SAI Coach would be engaged to train the youth and junior athletes. In addition,
 7 Assistant Coaches would be engaged. Federation has already provided four names, the other three names, further is yet to be identified.
- Therefore, the meeting accorded "in-principle" approval to the proposal of the Federation to appoint 8 Assistant Coaches to train the youth and junior athletes. As and when Federation submits details of Assistant Coaches, SAI would consider them and put up on file for approval of the Competent Authority.
- The meeting accorded "in- principle" approval for engagement of 1 Masseur, 1 Masseuse, 1 Physio (Male) and 1 Physio (Female), as proposed under ACTC proposal. However, the Federation has not furnished the names of these support staff. Therefore, as and when the Federation submits the details of the support staff, SAI would consider and seek approval of the Competent Authority.
- 5. Thus, the total amount approved under ACTC 2018-19 was Rs.8.13 cr. for the IWLF. Details are given as under:-
