## **REPORT**

## 19<sup>TH</sup> ASIAN YOUTH (BOYS & GIRLS) AND 24<sup>TH</sup> WOMEN AND 31<sup>ST</sup> MEN ASIAN WEIGHTLIFTING CHAMPIONSHIPS HELD AT KATHMANDU, NEPAL FROM 21-29 JULY, 2017

<u>Competition</u>:- 19<sup>th</sup> Asian Youth (Boys & Girls) and 24<sup>th</sup> Women and 31<sup>st</sup> Men Asian Weightlifting Championships was held at Kathmandu, Nepal from 21-29 July, 2017 under the Technical and Competition rules of International Weightlifting Federation (IWF).

Indian team consisting of 4 Youth Girls + 5 Junior Men + 5 Junior Women + 4 Coaches participated in these Championships.

The Weightlifting Championships held at Kathmandu, Nepal was a well organized competition. The competition was held at Army Physical Training and Sports Centre, Lagankhel, Nepal under the Technical & Competition rules of IWF.

**Itinerary:** The Indian team travelled from Sports Authority of India, Netaji Subhash National Institute of Sports, Patiala in one group on 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2017 at 7:50 a.m. from New Delhi and reached Kathmandu at 0940 a.m.

**Accommodation:** The accommodation to the Indian team members were provided at HOTEL RADISSION, LAZIMPAT, Kathmandu, NEPAL.

<u>Competition</u>: The verification of final entries was completed on 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2017 and after verification, Asian Weightlifting Federation confirmed the participation of 288 athletes (175 Men + 113 Women) from 29 countries across the Asia.
