**ACTC 2021-2022 for Weightlifting**

**Minutes of ACTC meeting held on 2<sup>nd</sup> November, 2021: Indian Weightlifting Federation (IWLF)**

A meeting to finalize the Annual Calendar for Training and Competition for Weightlifting for the year 2021-22 was held on 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2021 under the Chairmanship of Smt. Sujata Chaturvedi, Secretary (Sports) MYA&S at the Conference Hall, Sports Authority of India HQ, New Delhi.

List of participant is annexed.

1. At the outset, DG SAI welcomed all participants, and introduced the President and representatives of IWLF to Secretary (Sports). He further appraised everyone present on the revision of norms for funding under Assistance to NSF Scheme.
2. In accordance with the minutes of ACTC held on 07.06.2019, one of the binding decisions of the meeting was that the IWLF would ensure scientific testing of all players participating in national camps and international training/events at least once in a year. Parameters were required to be worked out within 4 weeks. However, till date this has not been implemented. Testing facilities are available at SAI Centres and scientific testing of players participating in national camps and international events are to be implemented and tests administered for all National campers **by 31.12.2021**. Data would be stored in suitable format consultation with SAI protecting the right to privacy of the players.
3. A brief review of the previous year's ACTC (2020-21) was undertaken during which the following were indicated:
  - 4.1 IWLF has achieved its specified Olympic target. However, the performance in Sr. Asian Championships (2 achieved against 4 targeted) and Jr. World Championship (1 achieved against 2 targeted) were not achieved.
  - 4.2 Hiring of personnel such as High Performance Director, Head Physiotherapist, and Masseur/Masseuse approved in the minutes was not completed.
  - 4.3 IWLF had committed to revamp the competition structure at the zonal level to promote the sports at the rural India but no initiative has been taken by IWLF during the last ACTC calendar. However, the same has been submitted this year.
  - 4.4 The targets for Coach Development and Referee/Judge Development proposed for 2021 were not achieved.

4. The ACTC for the year 2021-22 for Weightlifting was discussed as detailed below:
- 5.1 Secretary (Sports) stated that in order to develop the sport, IWLF should conduct more competitions at district and zonal level and also state level competitions in every state.
  - 5.2 IWLF shall finalize a selection policy for selection of athletes for major international competitions **by 31.01.2022** to ensure transparency and unambiguity. IWLF President informed that they are contemplating selection policy based on long term plan among the national campers so that the deserving weightlifters shall participate in the suitable international competition. The final policy should be uploaded on official website of the Indian Weightlifting Federation and a copy be forwarded to CEO (TOPS).
  - 5.3 IWLF shall, also develop a national ranking system **by 31.01.2022** which shall be in line with the selection policy and shall be updated every quarter. The same should also be published on the official website of IWLF and copy to be forwarded to CEO (TOPS).
  - 5.4 IWLF shall conduct regular athlete education programmes/awareness programmes to educate the weightlifters on doping awareness.
  - 5.5 Scientific data collected by IWLF shall be shared with the TOPS team as and when required for mutual benefit.
  - 5.6 Considering the performance of women athletes at the Olympics and other international competitions, it has been decided to introduce league system competition structure for women weightlifters under Khelo India vertical- Sports for Women to promote the sports across the Country.
5. Shri Sahadev Yadav, President, IWLF made the following commitments, which were included as binding decisions as a part of approved ACTC calendar and budget:
- 6.1 IWLF's main focus is on creating *bench strength* and *early talent scouting* at Junior and Youth level. Various sporting events such as Zonal, Inter Zonal, State and National Level Competitions and National Open Championship would be held for identification of talent. IWLF would submit a self-contained proposal for financial assistance, along with the policy and structure of competition to DG, SAI **by 31.01.2022**.
  - 6.2 IWLF submitted following measurable outcomes :

7. The calendar and budget were considered and approved with modifications pursuant to deliberations. The approved calendar and budget are at **Annexure A I to A VII**.
8. Other salient decisions are as below:

**8.1 National Coaching Camp (Senior)**

**8.2 National Coaching Camp (Junior)**

The Junior National Camp shall henceforth train at the National Centre of Excellence and the campers are to be admitted in the NCOEs of their choice. Therefore, the number of training days at the national camp prior to international tournaments shall not exceed 45 days.

**8.3 Foreign Training & Competition (Senior & Junior)**

**8.3.1** IWLF shall make all endeavours to adhere to the international event calendar approved in ACTC 2021-22.

**8.3.2** IWLF shall ensure that more athletes are encouraged to participate in international events to ensure maximum exposure and experience for the athletes. *Placed at Annexure-A II & A III.*

**8.3.3** It was decided that different teams across weight categories shall participate in different international competitions as per the level of the competition to maximise exposure among the bench. The final team will be decided based on the analysis of the international benchmarks of the tournament against performance of the players.

**8.3.4** IWLF shall ensure that there is participation of the teams from USA and Greece at the foreign training camp at Greece before 2022 Junior World championship.

**8.4 National Championships**

**8.5 Foreign Coaches**

**8.5.1** IWLF shall appoint a High Performance Director (HPD)/ Foreign Coach for Junior and Youth Weightlifters at the NCOEs and for redesigning the NIS course **by 31.12.2021**. Placed at Annexure-A V-1.

**8.5.2** The HPD/Coach shall oversee all the activities of junior and youth weightlifters in all the NCOEs on rotational basis.

**8.5.3** He will help in creating pathway for Indian coaches' development by redesigning and developing the NIS Diploma course.


